1 Diltiazem CD/Cardiezm = 1 large blue & white capsule (180 mg calcium channel blocker) No grapefruit do NOT chew or crush

1/2 Furosemide/Lasix = 1/2 of a tiny, round white pill (20 mg is 1/2 of 40 mg diuretic or water pill)

1 NAMENDA /Memantine = 1 small gray, oblong-shaped tablet (10 mg glutamate blocker)


1/2 ARICEPT /Donepezil = 1/2 small, round, pale-yellow coated tablet (5 mg is 1/2 10 mg tablet cholinesterase inhibitor) take with full glass of water

1 QUINAPRIL/Accupril = 1 round, reddish-brown pill with "20" stamped on one side (20 mg ACE inhibitor) take with full glass of water

1 Isosorbide Mono ER/Imdur = 1 bright-yellow, oblong-shaped tablet, scored in middle (60 mg nitrate to dilate blood vessels)

1 Pravastatin = 1 round, pale green pill with "PRA 40" stamped on one side
(40 mg statin to lessen body's cholesterol production)

Each morning 2 nasal sprays

Miacalcin/ calcitonin = 1 spray in alternate nostril each morning

(200 IU calcium nasal solution for bone health) use in left nostril one day, then in right nostril next day

ASTELIN/ azelastine HCL = 1 spray in each nostril every day in morning to stop nasal drip

use in both nostrils each morning
